9/11 - 25 years on and a generation's worth of reflection by the world

In 2021 I wrote the following words during my reflections about the events of 9/11/2001 and their root causes and, quite frankly, I have only a tiny bit more to add on this 25th anniversary of that fateful day:

"For many of us it is hard to put into words the lasting impression of the events of 9/11 in the USA.
